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PREFACE

On behalf of the Organization Committee, I would like to welcome all participants to the AQM 2005 (3rd International Symposium on Air Quality Management at Urban, Regional and Global Scales) and 14th IUAPPA Regional Conference

The 1st Air Quality Management Symposium was held on September 1997 in İstanbul. It was a unique and remarkable turning point for the development of air pollution science in the region. The symposium book, which was published as a special issue of Environmental Research Forum by Trans Tech Publishers has been distributed throughout the world. The 2nd Air Quality Management Symposium was held in 2001. The selected papers were published in a special issue of the Journal of Water & Soil pollution: Focus by Kluwer in 2003. In this Symposium, results will be presented and discussed from a wide variety of research fields including urban and rural air quality, aerosols, air quality modeling, air quality management, regional studies, impact on forest and vegetation, acid rain, ozone problems, assessment monitoring and control, global scale problems, industrial emissions, toxic and hazardous pollutants, decision support systems, risk management, odor management, indoor air quality, air quality prevention and education, air pollution impact on climate change, dust storm generation and transportation, and traffic emissions. The objective of AQM2005 is to facilitate sharing of scientific findings and provide a forum for the timely exchange of information among scientists and policy makers involved in the field of air quality. Throughout AQM 2005, we hope to bring together the latest scientific achievements in various research fields and promote fruitful discussion on future research and development. The AQM2005 Symposium is a regional conference of IUAPPA, and is supported by EFCA. TUNCAP is a member of EFCA and IUAPPA. As part of the Symposium, IUAPPA and EFCA have established a series of specialist seminars, for invited participants. IUAPPA's Global Atmospheric Forum, Special Session on Transport and Air Pollution in Mega Cities and EFCA's Shipping Emissions will explore alternative policy systems for tackling the problems in different regions of the world, and a special focus on the Mediterranean Region and on the role of technical and demand management measures in controlling pollution from vehicles. The symposium has aroused worldwide interest and collaboration with IUAPPA has increased the number of contributions, with more than 200 papers received. Around 150 oral and 40 poster papers will be presented in the symposium. Selected papers will be published in special issues of Environmental International by Elsevier and International Journal of Environment and Pollution by Inderscience.

We wish to thank The Scientific Committee and Editors (S. Topcu, M.F. Yardým, A. Bayram, C. Kahya, and T. Elbir) and D. Demirhan for her technical assistance.
